Consequences of Nursing Sin 2015-04-19

<u>Gen 4:1-16</u>

In story of sin/misery we see God's patience/mercy w/unrepentant sinner.

- Cain 1st person born in sin. No indication they twins. <u>Gen 4:1-5, Gen 3:15</u>
- Cain= "acquire, get, possess." Play on words & declaration of HOPE/gratitude
- Abel = breath, vapor. Prophecy of his short existence.

Abel shepherd, Cain farmer. Each offering appropriate to their vocation.

- Not appear anything wrong w/fruit as opposed to animal sacrifice.
 - Later, God commanded grain/harvest offerings.

Problem not offering but in Cain himself (religious). Jde 11-13, Heb 11:4, 1 Jn 3:11-12

Abel as much sinner as Cain but Abel righteous & offered in faith.
 ° Sin can reveal itself in what give to or keep from God.

Not told explicitly why Cain's rejected but rather than repent & please God, Cain became very angry w/God & Abel. <u>Gen 4:6-7, 1 Pet 5:8, Gen 3:16</u>

- God graciously seeks out & gently confronts sinful anger & warns of danger.
 o 'sin crouching' & 'do well' imply Cain knew what was right.
- Eve talked into sin; Cain can't be talked out of sin, even by God.
 - Cain's **response = silently reject** God's counsel & **hardened heart**.
 - Hardening process set into human race in 1st generation of sin.

Cain directs his anger, jealousy, hatred toward innocent brother. <u>Gen 4:8, 1 Jn 3:15,</u>
Not Abel's fault Cain's sacrifice not acceptable.

Sin begins w/wrong thoughts> wrong feelings> wrong words> wrong actions.

Like Adam, tries to hide sin from JC. Unlike A&E: lies & never admits sin. Gen 4:9-12

• Gen 3 curse personalized, intensified (toil harder) & added to (wander).

Ultimate penalty for Hebrew not death, but exile, loss of roots.
 Repentant heart response: 'Sentence fair. Mercy undeserved.' But Cain's hard heart assaults God's fairness, kindness, justice. <u>Gen 4:13-15, Rom 2:4-5</u>

- Murderer fears being murdered not omnipotent righteous God.
 - No fear/reverence for God, no indication sorrow for sin, or regret for Abel's death, or thought for parents who lost son....only preoccupied w/self.
- Even in Cain's unrepentance God extends mercy/compassion towards him.
 - Not sure exact nature of sign but this was mark of grace that God's protective hand on Cain in spite of his great sin. Common Grace

Account of God's patience/mercy towards unrepentant sinners & the devastating consequences of nursing sin.

- Unchecked sin within will eventually lead to devastation without. <u>Jam 1:14-15, Eph. 4:27, 31-32, Mt 5: 21-22a, 29-30</u>
 - **Uncontrolled anger**/jealousy **resulted** in Abel's **death** & **destroyed** Cain's **life**.
- Don't flirt/dabble w/sin, not even in thoughts.
 - Murder of Abel began w/Cain thinking Lord unjust w/him.
- Repent & by God's grace deal now w/your sin or soon you'll find yourself in the grip of monster you can't control....in a place you don't want to be.

Genesis 4:1-16

Now Adam knew Eve his wife, and she conceived and bore Cain, saying, "I have gotten a man with the help of the Lord." 2 And again, she bore his brother Abel. Now Abel was a keeper of sheep, and Cain a worker of the ground.

3 In the course of time Cain brought to the Lord an offering of the fruit of the ground, 4 and Abel also brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat portions. And the Lord had regard for Abel and his offering, 5 but for Cain and his offering he had no regard. So Cain was very angry, and his face fell.

6 The Lord said to Cain, "Why are you angry, and why has your face fallen? 7 If you do well, will you not be accepted? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door. Its desire is for you, but you must rule over it."

8 Cain spoke to Abel his brother. And when they were in the field, Cain rose up against his brother Abel and killed him. 9 Then the Lord said to Cain, "Where is Abel your brother?" He said, "I do not know; am I my brother's keeper?"

10 And the Lord said, "What have you done? The voice of your brother's blood is crying to me from the ground. 11 And now you are cursed from the ground, which has opened its mouth to receive your brother's blood from your hand. 12 When you work the ground, it shall no longer yield to you its strength. You shall be a fugitive and a wanderer on the earth."

13 Cain said to the Lord, "My punishment is greater than I can bear. 14 Behold, you have driven me today away from the ground, and from your face I shall be hidden. I shall be a fugitive and a wanderer on the earth, and whoever finds me will kill me."

15 Then the Lord said to him, "Not so! If anyone kills Cain, vengeance shall be taken on him sevenfold." And the Lord put a mark on Cain, lest any who found him should attack him. 16 Then Cain went away from the presence of the Lord and settled in the land of Nod, east of Eden.
