## Wait Upon El Roi 2015-11-22

## Gen 16:1-16

God's sovereignty not problem if doesn't conflict w/our desires or timetable.

- When fulfillment of God's promises delayed we "help Him out" but our contingency plans to God's way inevitably result in pain not progress.
- 10 yrs since promise: now Abram 85 & Sarai 75 discouraged by barrenness.
  - Purpose in everything God does, including delays.
    - Son must be seen as divine miracle, traceable to God's will & power.
- But impatience, fear & lack of faith lead A&S make tragic mistake In accordance w/custom give Abram her Egyptian maid. <u>Gen 16:1-4</u>, <u>Rom 14:23</u>
  - Right in eyes of society/contemporaries, but wrong in God's eyes.
    - o not give in to culture/expedience, even if right motives & godly goal.

Abram capitulates to pressure w/o prayer or weighing implications

- Problem isn't listening to wife; but abdicating spiritual leadership.
- o **Husbands** assume **loving leadership** in home & **wives let** them **take** it. God **not stop** Abram because he **not ask** for **God's wisdom/guidance**.
  - So what **begin** in **Egypt ends** in **bedroom w/Egyptian** slave which **resulted** in **sin, misery** for **all involved** & entire **human race** for all earthly time. Gal 4:29
    - o Israeli-Arab conflict traced back to this decision to "help God".

**Sin abounds** in **initial actions** & in their **responses** to dilemma their sin brought.

- No confession/repentance, nor confronting others sin. Rom. 5:20 & 2:4
- Abandoned by family & forgotten by Abram's God: H fled. Gen 16:6-9, 1 Pet 2:18-21
  - Running from problems never answer. Can't hide from God who put you there
    She not need change of location but change of heart.
  - God calls Hagar to humble herself: return & submit.
    - Be under authority God has ordained. Teen/parents, married/spouse in spite of difficulties....not physical abuse. Eph 6:1,
      - Obedience always comes before blessing.

Focuses Hagar on future & His promises not on wrongs done to her. Gen 16:10-13

- In **response** to **feeling loved/cared** for by God she **does** what **nobody** else **does** in Bible: **names God**. *El Roi*= '**one who sees**". **If** He **sees**, **then** He **cares**.
- God saw Hagar's affliction; as result, Hagar saw God's mercy & submitted. Return of Hagar humbling for A&S who lived w/consequences of actions.
  - A&S back where started, childless but now w/many troubles/sorrows.
    - How amazingly loving, patient, forgiving God is: A&S still vehicle for working out of His purposes: Messiah.

Lord in control of your circumstances. He cares for you; don't doubt His love. <u>2</u> <u>Pet. 3:9, Gal 4:22-26, Is 40:27-31, 49:15-16a</u>

- "spiritual birth" God's gracious work not product own efforts.
- To grow in godliness, we must grow in patience. Eph. 1:11
  - Faith seldom strengthened by success but by trusting God in midst of delays & difficulties.
- Obedience & patience is hard, but disobedience & "helping God" in flesh inevitably produce sin & misery.
  - He sees/knows future, trust Him & wait upon Lord.

Gen 16:1-16

Now Sarai, Abram's wife, had borne him no children. She had a female Egyptian servant whose name was Hagar. 2 And Sarai said to Abram, "Behold now, the Lord has prevented me from bearing children. Go in to my servant; it may be that I shall obtain children by her." And Abram listened to the voice of Sarai. 3 So, after Abram had lived ten years in the land of Canaan, Sarai, Abram's wife, took Hagar the Egyptian, her servant, and gave her to Abram her husband as a wife.

4 And he went in to Hagar, and she conceived. And when she saw that she had conceived, she looked with contempt on her mistress. 5 And Sarai said to Abram, "May the wrong done to me be on you! I gave my servant to your embrace, and when she saw that she had conceived, she looked on me with contempt. May the Lord judge between you and me!" 6 But Abram said to Sarai, "Behold, your servant is in your power; do to her as you please." Then Sarai dealt harshly with her, and she fled from her.

7 The angel of the Lord found her by a spring of water in the wilderness, the spring on the way to Shur. 8 And he said, "Hagar, servant of Sarai, where have you come from and where are you going?" She said, "I am fleeing from my mistress Sarai." 9 The angel of the Lord said to her, "Return to your mistress and submit to her." 10 The angel of the Lord also said to her, "I will surely multiply your offspring so that they cannot be numbered for multitude." 11 And the angel of the Lord said to her,

"Behold, you are pregnant and shall bear a son. You shall call his name Ishmael, because the Lord has listened to your affliction. He shall be a wild donkey of a man, his hand against everyone and everyone's hand against him, and he shall dwell over against all his kinsmen."

13 So she called the name of the Lord who spoke to her, "You are a God of seeing," for she said, "Truly here I have seen him who looks after me." 14 Therefore the well was called Beer-lahai-roi; it lies between Kadesh and Bered.

15 And Hagar bore Abram a son, and Abram called the name of his son, whom Hagar bore, Ishmael. 16 Abram was eighty-six years old when Hagar bore Ishmael to Abram.
