Be Hallowed Father 2018-06-24

Matt 6:7-9

"And when you pray, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard for their many words.

Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask Him. Pray then like this: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name."

Jesus Christ modeled that the key to relationship with the Father (who is spirit) is prayer. John 4:24

- He gave us a pattern/structure....not specific prayer to be repeated.
 - Begins with incredible result of Gospel. <u>Matthew 6:9a, John 1:12-13,</u> Ephesians 1:5-6

Our Father: foundation of prayer is based on sonship not friendship.

- Father is title of intimate relationship.
 - No Old Testament saint addressed God as Father
 - New Testament (least 275x) Christians instructed to address God as Father based on our adoption because of blood of Jesus Christ.
- By God's grace, through faith, we are justified, adopted and blessed because of Christ's righteousness, not our own. Gospel

Sonship is prayer's foundation and God Himself who sovereignly reigns in heaven is power behind our prayer. <u>Matthew 6:9b, Psalm 135:6, 102:19, 1 Timothy 6:15b-16</u> "Prayer is to impress you with God, much more than it is to impress God with you or your needs." John MacArthur

- God always was and will remain absolutely independent and self-sufficient.
 - Eternal Creator who transcends all spatial/geographical limitations rules from highest place (heaven) yet is wholly present everywhere.
 - Above, around and within us is the Omnipotent One!
- He alone is almighty and can't be tricked, thwarted, or defeated.
 - o Has power do whatever He decides to do, all His unchanging holy will.
- Christian approach throne confidently because of relationship with God but also respectfully with awe because of who He is. <u>Hebrews 4:16, Romans 8:15-16</u>
 - Not "Hey Buddy" but not in fear either.
 - Look for assurance of salvation in prayer not from others!

"Hallowed be Thy name" desired outcome of all prayer. Matthew 6:9c, Revelation 5:12,

 Not declaration but request (1st) omnipotent Father would sovereignly act in ways that glorify Himself. Romans 1:5, 3 John 7

A name in antiquity stood for a person's whole character.

- Various names of God in Scripture are descriptions of His character.
 - All of who God is manifest in person and work of Jesus Christ and find their expression in Gospel. <u>Hebrews 1:3, Colossians1:15a</u>

"hallow" means sanctify...same Greek word is used for both English words.

- Sanctify can mean *make* holy or *treat as* holy.
 - When God sanctifies us, it means that He makes us holy.
 - o But when we sanctify God, it means that we treat Him as holy.

- Jesus is saying ask Father to change us so we "Hallow" Him (treat Him as holy) in/thru our lives 24/7. <u>1 Corinthians 10:31, Matthew</u> 5:16, Philippians 1:9-11
- Hallow name of Jesus Christ when you trust, obey and glorify Him in/thru our lives.

Foundation of prayer is sonship, power behind prayer is the eternal, sovereign Lord.

- So begin prayer with gratefulness and awe of your salvation, be overwhelmed by the greatness of our Lord as you worship Him.
- Pray with heart's desire that above all else God would sovereignly act in ways that will glorify Himself.
- 1st request in your prayer should be that the Father would sanctify you by making you more like Christ so His great name will be hallowed.
