Choose Wisely 11-01-15

Gen 13:5-18

One small turning point in a stream high in Rocky Mts. in Colorado separates & leads to 2 entirely different destinations: Pacific or Atlantic Ocean.

In A&L's separation we see contrast in motives & actions that leads to 2 completely different destinies for them, their families/descendants.
 Competition for grazing land between A&L's herdsmen led to conflict which Abram handled graciously & wisely. Gen 13:5-9, Jas 4:1-3, Mt 5:23-24

- Abram knew it takes 2 to tangle so he took initiative to resolve conflict
 o Placed relationships & unity ahead of his personal rights,
- Abram not exercise Patriarchal right & order Lot to leave. Instead he graciously yielded his rights, sacrificed his interests, gave Lot 1st choice & by faith trusted God to fulfill His promises. Phil 2:4-11, Mt 5:5, 9
 - Much strife avoided if value relationships over rights & trust JC care.
 - o We can be **generous** in **material/personal** ways if **truly believe** & **trust** in **God's love** for us & in **his ability** to **provide/care** for **us**.

Jordan fairest separation but righteous Lot took all of best land & left Abram w/seemingly worthless land. Gen 13:10-13, 1 Jn 2:16, Jas 1:14-15, 2 Pet 2:7-8

- Lot chose by sight/greed, not w/spiritual in mind & reaped destruction.
 - o **looked** toward **Sodom** > tent **near** > house **in** Sodom> city **leader**!
 - Tension: friend of sinners, but not tainted by their sin.
 - o Wife died, fled home, incest w/daughters: Moabites & Ammonites.
 - End: This righteous man moved by material things was financially bankrupt living in cave.
- Choose godliness over greed: decisions from eternal perspective.
 - o What happened to Lot's stuff will happen to all your stuff.
- <u>Don't look out for #1 but look up to #1.</u> Mt 6:19-20, 33
 Promises of God not thwarted by unselfishness of Abram or materialism of Lot. Gen 13:14-18, 2 Cor 5:7, Rom 4:20-22
 - Included Lot's land: Not technically own Canaan so only parted ways.
 - God used discouraging dust from famine for comfort, hope for future
 - walking thru land symbolic of staking a claim & proclamation of trust that Lord able & willing to do what He promised to do.
 - o Literally walking by faith
 - 3rd altar characterized Abram's communion/friendship w/God.
- o Trust JC for your portion & be grateful for what He provides. Seemingly insignificant choices can be life-changing for you, kids, grandkids
 - o They **begin chain** of **events** > salvation, marriage, tragedy.
 - Since choices often result in eternally significant consequences, we should make decisions in line w/God's principles.
 - o Choose relationships over rights;
 - o Godliness over greed;
 - o Walk by faith in God's promises: especially when looks bleak.
 - Look continually to promises of God which are forever yours in JC.

o If have God & His promises, have everything you'll ever need.

Gen 13:5-18

And Lot, who went with Abram, also had flocks and herds and tents, 6 so that the land could not support both of them dwelling together; for their possessions were so great that they could not dwell together, 7 and there was strife between the herdsmen of Abram's livestock and the herdsmen of Lot's livestock. At that time the Canaanites and the Perizzites were dwelling in the land.

8 Then Abram said to Lot, "Let there be no strife between you and me, and between your herdsmen and my herdsmen, for we are kinsmen. 9 Is not the whole land before you? Separate yourself from me. If you take the left hand, then I will go to the right, or if you take the right hand, then I will go to the left." 10 And Lot lifted up his eyes and saw that the Jordan Valley was well watered everywhere like the garden of the Lord, like the land of Egypt, in the direction of Zoar. (This was before the Lord destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah.) 11 So Lot chose for himself all the Jordan Valley, and Lot journeyed east. Thus they separated from each other. 12 Abram settled in the land of Canaan, while Lot settled among the cities of the valley and moved his tent as far as Sodom. 13 Now the men of Sodom were wicked, great sinners against the Lord.

14 The Lord said to Abram, after Lot had separated from him, "Lift up your eyes and look from the place where you are, northward and southward and eastward and westward, 15 for all the land that you see I will give to you and to your offspring forever. 16 I will make your offspring as the dust of the earth, so that if one can count the dust of the earth, your offspring also can be counted. 17 Arise, walk through the length and the breadth of the land, for I will give it to you." 18 So Abram moved his tent and came and settled by the oaks of Mamre, which are at Hebron, and there he built an altar to the Lord.
