Sovereignty and Responsibility 2015-12-13

Gen 17:1-5, 9-10, 15-21

23 years **after** covenant **promises** Abram is **content** w/**Ishmael**, his 13 yr. legitimate son/heir, as the **son of promise**.

- We often settle for lesser things that our flesh produces.
 - But El Shaddai [God Almighty] had plan for Abram & us that's grander than could be imagined. Gen 17:1-5 & 18, Eph 1:11

Sovereign God, not man, determines course of history in His time/way, not ours.

- Not much human free will or debate in this chapter!
 - Changes A&S's names, states Sarai have promised son named Isaac, denies Abram's request, establishes covenant w/Isaac.
- Non-sovereign God isn't God at all, no guarantee could fulfill single promise. Unilateral covenant not mean living within covenant required nothing of Abram.
 - Responsible to walk before their promise-making God blamelessly.
 - o **not "perfection**" but **expression** of **faithful obedience** to Him.
 - Father knew we couldn't do but a descendant of Abraham WOULD walk before Him blamelessly for us....JC. <u>2 Cor 5:21, 1</u> Jn 3:5, 1 Pet 2:22,
 - God's choosing & setting apart had real-life moral & ethical implications.
 - Not only share family name, but bear family resemblance in life, character, speech, thoughts, actions....holiness/Christlikeness.
 - Live faithful, obedient life fitting for those who belong to God not earn right standing/His love but act of devotion, gratitude & love.
 - knowing when fall short have covering in JC.
 - Shy away telling obligations: accused of works salvation or legalism.
 - o **JC/Paul/John challenged** people's **faith** & their **practice**. <u>1 Jn 3:7-10, Tit</u> 2:11-12, Phil 2:12-13, Jn 8:10-11

Cxn position before God not result of obedience but proven by it.

- That's why **following general call** to **obedience**, God **commanded** a very **specific** demonstration of **obedience**. *Gen* 17:9-10, Col 2:11-12
 - His people were to stand out distinctively among all people by way lived
 by commonplace sign they were to bear. Circumcision
 - Later replaced by in NT by non-gender specific sign: baptism.
- Not sure why this particular cultural symbol. Why not tattoo?
 - tied to descendants & promised seed; fleshly, sinful, nature from birth must be cut off; connection w/circumcision of flesh/heart (Deut. 30:6, Mt. 22:37); importance of sexual purity in obedience.
- More important than speculations of why circumcision chosen is what this sign pointed TO: El Shaddai's covenant faithfulness.
- o I've **not forgotten** for **13 years**. **Believe promises** I **made** to you Abram. **El Shaddai** has **not forgotten you** either. *Eph 3:16-20, C.S. Lewis mud pie quote*
 - Don't settle for lesser Ishmael things your flesh can produce but trust & hope in Almighty, sovereign God to do impossible in your marriage, children, future, habitual sin, etc. <u>Leland Wong letterhead</u>: Josh 10:13, 2 Kings 6:6, Ps 48:14

Genesis 17:1-5, 9-10, 15-21

- 1 When Abram was ninety-nine years old the Lord appeared to Abram and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless, 2 that I may make my covenant between me and you, and may multiply you greatly." 3 Then Abram fell on his face. And God said to him, 4 "Behold, my covenant is with you, and you shall be the father of a multitude of nations. 5 No longer shall your name be called Abram, but your name shall be Abraham, for I have made you the father of a multitude of nations.
- <u>9-10</u> And God said to Abraham, "As for you, you shall keep my covenant, you and your offspring after you throughout their generations. 10 This is my covenant, which you shall keep, between me and you and your offspring after you: Every male among you shall be circumcised.
- 15-21 And God said to Abraham, "As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her name Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. 16 I will bless her, and moreover, I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall become nations; kings of peoples shall come from her." 17 Then Abraham fell on his face and laughed and said to himself, "Shall a child be born to a man who is a hundred years old? Shall Sarah, who is ninety years old, bear a child?"
- 18 And Abraham said to God, "Oh that Ishmael might live before you!" 19 God said, "No, but Sarah your wife shall bear you a son, and you shall call his name Isaac. I will establish my covenant with him as an everlasting covenant for his offspring after him. 20 As for Ishmael, I have heard you; behold, I have blessed him and will make him fruitful and multiply him greatly. He shall father twelve princes, and I will make him into a great nation. 21 But I will establish my covenant with Isaac, whom Sarah shall bear to you at this time next year."
