## Matthew: Behold Your King 12-03-06

## Matthew 16:15-18

He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" 16 Simon Peter replied, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven.

And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.

Bible not collection of stories but one story with one theme (God's plan of redemption) and one main character from Genesis to Revelations: Jesus Christ.

- Goal of Route 66 to focus on the Story of Redemption (Gospel) and Jesus Christ in every book, including New Testament.
  - Jesus Christ is eternal King, and we are His chosen subjects and friends.

Matthew is fittingly the connecting link between Old Testament and New Testament because it was written to Jews to prove Jesus is their promised Messiah and King. <u>Matthew 5:17</u>

- Matthew quotes Old Testament more than any other Gospel writer...more than 60 times.
- No effort to explain Jewish customs, assumed reader already understood.

**Matthew** written around **55-65** AD ...probably most widely read book of **Bible**. Matthew 9:9, 10:3

- Matthew means "the gift of God" .... Levi was probably his preconversion name.
  - One of 12 disciples...Jewish tax collector for Rome, probably rich and hated.

Matthew Gospel of arrival promised Old Testament King and His kingdom. "Kingdom" said 55 times in Matthew. <u>See outline at the end.</u>

- **Declared** a King **reverently** at his **birth**, **mockingly** in **death**. Matthew 2:2, 27:37
- Only in Matthew Jesus' genealogy traced to King David and Abraham, father of nation of Israel.
  - In Matthew Jesus referred to as Son of David 10 times...only 6 times in other Gospels.

Jesus explains "Kingdom of heaven" 32 times .... nowhere else in any other Gospels.

• Kingdom universal, invisible, and eternal not reference to a place. <u>Luke</u> <u>17:20-21</u>

- Among them and US because where King Jesus is, there is His kingdom.
- Jews were expecting conquering, liberating, uniting, powerful king.
  - Jesus not King of their expectations but suffering servant described in Isaiah.

Matthew is **story of Great King shed His royal robes, put on** the **cloak of** a **commoner** so commoners be **royal children** of Most High God. <u>2 Corinthians 8:9,</u> <u>Ephesians 1:4-5</u>

- Matthew challenges us with most crucial and personal question facing every human being: "Is Jesus Christ the King of your life?" <u>Matthew</u> <u>16:15-18, 4:17</u>
  - **More** than **outward** (kneel or bow), **submit will** and **desires** to King Jesus.
    - Daily living in submission to Kingship of Jesus.

Giving willing, joyful obey, honor, reverence to a king is foreign to us.

- Want a king that fulfills our desires, do what we want Him to do.
  - By God's grace we must cast down throne of own ego, self-will, pride and replace it with glorious throne of King Jesus.

As King, Jesus Christ desires and deserves primacy and authority over all aspects of our lives .... He's King we are His subjects! <u>Matthew 22:37-39,</u> 6:33, Luke 9:23, 1 Samuel 15:22a

- No part of Christians life should be lived apart from Jesus' rule.
  - Time, treasure, talent **not** "ours" but His to use as He desires.
    - His glory should be our greatest desire.
- To submit to King Jesus, you must know Him as Savior, know His decrees in Word & then obey by power of indwelling King. <u>WSC #26</u>

King Jesus sovereign rules over everything visible and invisible, material and immaterial, all creation, beings (Satan and demons), people and kings, times, places, cultures, and kingdoms.

- **King** Jesus **commands** His **CHOSEN subjects** to **tell world** it's King has come with **salvation** to **all who repent**.
  - They too, like you, can become citizens of greatest kingdom EVER! <u>Matthew 28:18-20, 1 Peter 2:9-10, John 15:15-16</u>
