Mark: Jesus, The Servant of Man 2023-11-05

Mark 10:42-45...summarizes Mark

Jesus called them to him and said to them, "You know that those who are considered rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. 43 But it shall not be so among you.

But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, 44 and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all.

45 For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Describe room.... location, GOAL, personalities, likes or dislikes...still same room!

- The Gospels are four distinct accounts of one person with one purpose.... good news
- Jesus came from heaven to serve and returned to heaven to serve!
 Mark known in New Testament as John Mark.... John his Jewish name...
 Mark his Roman name.
 - Son of Mary, rich woman in Jerusalem ...Likely Last Supper in her home.
 - Cousin of Barnabas join Paul and Barnabas on first mission journey and caused disagreement, so they parted ways.

First gospel written A.D. **55-59...based** on **Peter's testimony**, Mark referred to as Peter's spiritual son. <u>1 Peter 5:13</u>

• All but 31 verses quoted in other gospels, Matthew and Luke used Mark as source material.

Shortest and most succinct of four Gospels and thus most often translated New Testament book.

- Wycliffe translators usually begin translation work with Mark's Gospel. Letter written to Roman Christians.... people of action.... called "Go Gospel" See outline at the end.
 - Fill with deeds, not words— events move quickly.
 - "Immediately" used 39 times, "and" used 1,375 times.... twothirds verses begin with "and".
 - No genealogy, reference to Law, Jewish customs, few Old Testament quotes.

Mark emphasized Jesus' actions more than teaching. Only 18 of Jesus' 70 parables—some only one sentence.... all four of parables he details about servanthood.

- Mark lists 20 of Jesus' 35 miracles.... highest proportion in gospels.
 - Miracles illustrate Jesus' power, compassion and proved his authority over creation, sickness, spiritual forces, and death.

- Mark's point: **Messiah proven not** by **what said** but **what** He **did**. Jesus Christ, **master, and servant** of **all**.... **set aside royal robes**, tied **servant's towel** around waist, **tended** to **needs** of **humankind**.
 - Jesus' ultimate act of servanthood: give life as ransom. Mark 10:45
 - He did **not come** to be **served**, but **to serve**.

Deity serving created being **contrary** virtually **all** world **religions** and u**ncomfortable** to natural **mind**.

- Almost blasphemous to call Jesus our servant... misunderstand.
 - Jesus our servant not slave because we desperately need a servant.

We are slaves to sin, flesh, death and need a servant Messiah to set us free.

- Servant Jesus came and gave His life as ransom to redeem us from slavery.
 - Jesus Christ death paid sin and penalty, and broke sin and power.
 Philippians 2:7-9, 1 Peter 1:18-19
 - Still serve Christians by praying for us and empowering holiness.

Mark presents Jesus as suffering Servant who came serve and sacrifice for His people.

- Jesus calls His people to be like Him: with humility give self in service and love to others. *Mark* 10:43-44, 9:35, *John*.13:12-16,
 - Struggle against sacrificial service: seek own comfort and interests.

Jesus today serving us by convicting of sin and empowering us to serve and love others sacrificially without need for recognition or reward, so God glorified.

- Jesus Christ **came** from **heaven** to **serve**, **returned** to heaven to **serve**! **Jesus** the **servant** now **highly exalted** and **serving through us**. <u>Mark 16:15-20</u>, Brengle quote
 - Encourage hopeless, proclaim liberty to captives, forgive in Jesus.
 - Ask God for miracles confirm gospel and meet needs.
 - We have a Great God who continues to do great things.
 - How doing let Jesus serve others through you in home, job, or school, LEFC?
