1 Peter: Our Hope in Trials 2024-03-24

1 Peter 1:6-7

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In this you rejoice, though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials,

7 so that the tested genuineness of your faith—more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ.

We are different in many ways. All know suffering and trials. 1 Peter is the key to Christian to have joy midst suffering.

Written from "Babylon" most likely code name for Rome. 5:13, Revelations 16:19, 17:5, 18:2

- Written 62-67 AD to Gentile Christians in Asia Minor (Turkey) facing deadly persecution.
 - **Pre-Nero persecution yet** world **hostile toward** Christians. <u>See</u> <u>outline at the end.</u>
- Main themes: Holy living in hostile world; hope in midst of suffering.
 - Suffering and trials are **not surprises or random but ordained** by God for a **purpose**.

Various forms of trials and unjust suffering in 1 Peter: relational, spiritual, emotion, and physical.

• God even use sinful acts for his own holy designs: Jesus' crucifixion.

• However, he never commands sin or approves of sinning. Christianity is life of tremendous, abiding joy <u>if we keep in mind</u> we are chosen, born again to living hope, and have permanent, heavenly inheritance. <u>1 Peter 1:3-4</u>,

• This sure, living hope **brings joy** that **sustains** us in **midst of suffering**. **Not just** look **future for hope but reasons** to **rejoice today**. <u>1 Peter 1:6, 4:12-13, 2</u> <u>Corinthians 4:17</u>

- "Little while" means expected but temporary trials and pain, in comparison to eternity.
- "If GOD deems necessary" means trials ordained by God.
 - Encourage: God does not try people without reason.

Connection between hardship and holiness: refine gold and remove impurities.

- Impurities are areas in us not Jesus-like: ungrateful, greedy, bitter, or angry.
 - Faith and character proven genuine by enduring and trusting in God, in hardship, not just in good times. <u>James 1:2-4, Romans</u> <u>5:2-5, See C.S. Lewis quote at end.</u>

God's purpose in trials and suffering: faith more pure, genuine and more like Jesus Christ... who is the foundation and example for joy amidst trials. <u>1 Peter 1:7-8, 2:20-21</u>

- "You love Him" implies continual experiencing and abiding in Jesus.
- "Believe in Him" means trusting Jesus as being faithful to all his promises.

Sense of regularly resting in and enjoying Jesus brings unique type of rejoice.

- "Inexpressible" only here in New Testament: beyond power of words to describe.
- "Filled with glory" Old Testament reference to radiance that surrounded God's presence.
 - Heaven before heaven, experienced now in fellowship with unseen Jesus.... standing with us in furnace of suffering and trials.

Hundreds of people in Jesus' lifetime saw him physically yet never really saw him. "Seeing they did not see," *Matthew 13:13, John 9:39, 20:29*

- But by God's grace, thru Scripture we see Jesus far deeper than most who saw him face to face.
 - Because we see Jesus with eyes of the heart through the Word, you love and trust him, and now (progressively) receive goal of it all.... salvation.
- God does everything to guarantee eternal salvation by sustaining our faith. <u>1</u> <u>Peter 1:4-5</u>
 - The word "guard" is present participle, meaning **continually** being **guarded** by **God's power**.

World increasingly hostile to Christian faith, biblical worldview, and morality.

- Divine plan IS trials and suffering.... His plan is endurance, not escape. <u>2 Corinthians 12:7-10</u>
- Christians find hope and joy in sovereign design of suffering and trials: more Jesus-like, depending on God.
 - By grace we cling to the Lord and trust Him in midst trials and unjust suffering.
 - When holy refining over, precious gold produced that is of greatest beauty and usability and brings great glory to God.
