## Lessons From Route 66: The Story of Redemption 2024-06-02

Think of some of the wild things that are going on right now that can cause us concern, worry or anxiety. Good examples: Trump verdict, chaos in the Middle East, inflation......where is hope and encouragement in hard times?

• Find hope and endurance by recalling the Lord's faithfulness, and trust in His promises for the future.

**Route 66:** The Bible is over a **1500-year** time span on **3 continents**: Asia, Africa and Europe.

- It was originally written in 3 languages: Hebrew, Arabic, Greek, and was written by over 40 authors.
  - Authors included kings, peasants, philosophers, fishermen, poets, farmers, scholars.
- **1. Recalling** the Lord's **past faithfulness gives** enduring **faith** and **hope** in **hard** times.
  - People in the Bible faced incredible difficulties at times seemingly from nowhere (i.e. Job, Elijah, Paul) or brought on by themselves (i.e. David, Sampson, Peter).
    - The overarching Old Testament theme is not the rebellion or failure of God's people, but God's faithfulness to continually redeem them from their messes and sin.
      - Remembering the Lord's past faithfulness to yourself and others gives hope and endurance during difficult times.
        <u>Deuteronomy 5:15, Psalm 77:11, 2 Timothy 2:8, Jude 17-18, 1</u>
        <u>Corinthians 15:20-21</u>
        - My current struggle is with retirement.... remember Jesus' past faithfulness.
  - The greatest testimony of the Lord's past faithfulness is His provision of our Savior.
    - 4 Old Testament covenant promises, and 300 Old Testament Messianic prophecies were fulfilled by Jesus Christ.
    - Jesus is the greater reality of Old Testament shadows: Adam, Moses, Melchizedek, David, Joseph, High Priest, Noah's Ark, Jacob's ladder, Passover lamb, sacrifices, manna, and the bronze serpent.
      - Jesus and the cross are a scarlet thread throughout the Story of Redemption.
- 2. **Trust** in Lord's **yet unfulfilled promises** in order to help us to **endure** and **give us hope** in **difficult** times.
  - In hard times, Old Testament saints hoped in the promise of One who WOULD come.
  - In the **New Testament, hope in Jesus' 2**<sup>nd</sup> coming (assured by 1<sup>st</sup> coming) **encouraged** New Testament saints in **difficult times**. <u>Hebrews</u> 11:13; 16, Colossians 3:2, 2 Peter 3:13, Romans 8:18

- Our future eternal life is sure because of God's utter truthfulness and His past faithfulness to His promises.
- 3. In difficult times, obedience is a fruit of trust in the Lord's past and future faithfulness.
  - This principle is demonstrated in the Old Testament through people like Noah, Abraham, Moses, David and Ruth.
  - It's also declared in the **New Testament**. <u>Hebrews 11:8, Jeremiah 2:17, John 14:15-17, 1 John 2:3</u>
    - You are not saved because you do good or obey you do good and obey because you are saved.
  - Genuine faith and trust in the Lord during hard times produces God honoring, Holy Spirit empowered obedience. <u>John 15:5, Romans 6:6,</u> 14, 18, 22
    - God has graciously given Christians everything they need to obey.
      - The Cross has paid sin's penalty and broken sin's power....
      - Obedience is possible because we are no longer slaves to sin.

The Lord's table is a regular application of this principle. <u>1 Corinthians 11:23-</u>26

- Remember the Lord's past faithfulness of providing a promised Savior.
- Hope in the Lord's future promises of eternal life with Him.
- In response.... joyfully and obediently celebrate the Lord's table.

**Hard** and difficult times are **here** and in the future, but **don't** be despondent and **lose hope** and **joy.** 

- Remember this lesson from Route 66....our Sovereign God has been completely faithful in the past and will fulfill ALL His promises that He made for future.
  - The Lord is greatly glorified if by His grace through the Holy Spirit's power we joyfully walk in obedience during hard and difficult times.
