## Lessons From Route 66: Our Sovereign God 2024-06-09

## Ephesians 1:11

In him we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of him who works all things according to the counsel of his will,

All scripture is relevant for us today. 2 Timothy 3:14-17

- The Old Testament **reflects practically** what **New Testaments** presents in **principle**.
  - o God is sovereign in accomplishing all His purposes in the world and in your life.

The Lord **governs ALL** events, **great** and **small** to **fulfil** His **perfect** and **beautiful plan**.

- No world leader or power can resist the will of God, nor interfere with His plan. Jeremiah 32:17; 1 Timothy 6:15-16; <u>Ephesians 1:11; Proverbs 21:1</u>, Romans 9:19b
  - Good examples of world powers that could not interfere: Nebuchadnezzar, Pharoah, Roman empire, elect.
    - His grace is irresistible towards lost family and friends.
- God is sovereign in the miraculous but is also sovereign over the ordinary and mundane.
  - Seemingly insignificant, "little" things, or "coincidences" are gracefully, and purposefully orchestrated events.
    - Examples: Ruth, Jonah, testimonies. <u>Ruth 2:3, Proverbs</u>
       16:33, Jonah 4:6,
  - o His will is done in spite of your weakness, imperfection, and

The Bible is a record of the Lord sovereignly liberating men from their sin and their messes.

- The Bible testifies to our omnipotent God's patience and faithfulness in continually redeeming His people from their messes, sin, and bondage.
  - Examples: Israel in bondage in Egypt, Joseph in prison, demoniac.
- His grace and mercy arrive at exactly the right time and in the best way!
  - His "best way" many times includes suffering and trials. <u>Isaiah</u>
     <u>55:8-9, Genesis 50:20, Romans 8:28, Proverbs 14:12</u>

Neither Old Testament nor New Testament contains **examples** or **promises** believers **escape affliction**.... it's in fact the **opposite**.

- **Suffering** in hard times is the most **common thread** throughout **scripture**. *1 Peter 2:19-23* 
  - Suffering and trials are not surprising but purposeful.
    - Grow dependence upon God, Jesus-likeness, and endurance.

Both then and now God's people struggle to believe the Lord is sovereign and in control of ALL.

- Again and again, God's people get into trouble and sin because they
  believe and act as though they can handle difficult situations better than
  God.
  - We don't trust Him to come through when and in the <u>way we</u> think He should.

When contentment in God decreases God's people try find a solution or satisfaction in something other than God, which leads to idolatry, immorality, money, materialism. *Ecclesiastes 2:10-11* 

- Destruction begins with "little" compromises and disobedience.
  - o Examples: Solomon inter-married, Saul doesn't destroy all.
    - Compromise with evil leads to doing the unthinkable: idolatry, immorality.
      - Holiness does not have an on or off switch. Jude 21, James 4:3.
- You can't make peace with the flesh, because the flesh will never make peace with you.
  - If you do not deal with "little" sin then gradually, imperceptibly, you will sink into moral and spiritual collapse that affects others. Examples of this include Jonah and David.

**Find contentment** with your **present** situation **by trusting** that **God** is **sovereign** over all things **great** and **small** in the **world** and in **your life**. <u>Job 13:15a, 1 Timothy</u> 6:6, Philippians 4:11-13, 19, Ecclesiastes 12:13,

- The fight of faith is the fight to keep your heart content in Jesus Christ.
  - He is for YOU and His plan is perfect in your life, even when circumstances are not.
