Recalibrate Your Perspective 2024-09-22

Colossians 3:2

Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth.

Retirement plan; **future goals direct present action**. Examples: eating **healthy**, being **debt-free**.

• The **Main** point is that the **Lord** wants **Christian lives** to be **dominated** by an **eternal perspective**.

God calls Christians to live with an eternal perspective, yet many believers primarily live with an earthly future, rather than eternal future, in mind.

• We pursue good but eternally worthless things that are eventually destroyed or left behind when they die. <u>John 12:43</u>, <u>John 6:27</u>, <u>2 Peter 3:10-13</u>

The most eye-opening moment in eternal existence is the crossing from this life to the next.

- For the unbeliever, they feel the **reality** of **Jesus Christ**, and of **sin**. For the Christian, maybe **joy**, maybe **regret?** Because the **unseen** is now **seen**.
 - We realize we foolishly focused the majority of our short life on the temporal and worthless.
- How would you live this week, if you knew it was your last? In comparison to eternity your life short. It's imperative to invest it NOW in 4 things that are eternal: God, the Word, people's souls, and Godly character. James 4:14, Psalm 90:2, Mark 13:31, 2 Corinthians 5:10, 1 Timothy 4:8
 - Live for God's glory and eternal treasures like fellowship with Jesus in Word and prayer, praying for and serving others, discipling, teach Sunday school, "one anothers."

The **Holy Spirit** must **transform** and **recalibrate** our **heart** to **desire** and **pursue** the **unseen (eternal)** above the **seen (temporal)**. <u>Colossians 3:2, 2</u> <u>Corinthians 4:16-18, 5:7, Hebrews 11:1, Romans 12:2</u>

- Living for the "seen" means a life focused and dictated by things of this world and of flesh.
- Living for the "unseen" means a life focused and dictated by eternal realities beyond the present senses, like Jesus Christ, heaven and hell, and eternity.
 - Hearts that value and desire the Lord above all else will live with an eternal perspective with delight not duty.

If you live for the unseen above the seen, you will give higher priority to inward character and holiness over outward appearance and worldly praises or accomplishments. <u>1 Peter 3:3-4</u>, <u>Galatians 5:22-24</u>

 This is especially relevant with today's self-centered, image-oriented world.

- If you're young, you have a certain look. If you're old, you try to look young. We have to have the "right stuff", or have the right "achievements".
- We spend lots of time and money to make our exterior look good, while inside we are ugly and broken.
 - The most important thing is not looks, but who you are becoming: holy and Christ-like
- By God's grace, become beautiful on inside.
- Humble, patient, generous, selfless and compassionate.
 From the heart springs all words and actions, all issues of life. The heart filters the view of cornfield or rain through personal context. <u>Matthew 12:34-35</u>, Matthew 6:19-21,
 - Every day you are either moving toward or away from your heart's delight.
 - Living for the seen and temptation is to move away. Living for the unseen and eternal is to move closer
 - You can't change the past, but you can change the future. <u>Psalm 90:12,</u> Colossians 3:2, Ephesians 5:15-16
 - Daily evaluate the opportunity cost: the cost of doing or not doing a project.
 - Make decisions about your time, money, or other priorities that reflect living for eternity. Look at the beach vs. a grain of sand.

The Lord wants **Christian lives dominated** by an **eternal** perspective **through living** for the **unseen above** the **seen** and **focus** on **inner holiness over outward appearance** (hunger and thirst for righteousness).

- Carpe diem: seize the day, week or life for the glory of God and by God's grace live with an eternal perspective. See Ravenhill, and Studd quotes at the end
 - o Invest your life in what will last an eternity!
